We are looking for a Swedish Special Educational Needs Coordinator ("specialpedagog"). Combined with some teaching or other job duties it will be a full-time position.

Who are we looking for?

The successful candidates will meet the criteria below. Emphasis will also be put on the candidate's personal traits as we are keen to find the right staff members to join our team of engaged teachers.

Essential:

- Swedish qualification as SENCO ("specialpedagog").
- Student-centred approach and able to forge positive relationships with pupils to encourage pupils' participation and learning.
- A flexible team player with good communication skills and the ability to take initiatives.
- Experience of supporting staff development within your area of expertise.
- Fluent in Swedish and proficient in English

Desirable:

- Teacher qualification in one/several subjects in Compulsory school (years 0 to 9)
- Experience of working as a SENCO in a school setting.
- Experience of using ICT in your work, preexisting knowledge of SchoolSoft and Google Classroom is extra desirable.
- Have the right to live and work in the United Kingdom.

probation period of one academic year which will extend to a fixed term contract, a total of three years employment.

Work visa

Following the UK's exit from the European Union, any non-British citizen must prove their right to live and work in the UK. If required, the Swedish School in London will sponsor and support the successful candidate to apply for a three-year work visa (paid by the school).

Your application

Your complete application must be submitted in English due to visa requirements and consist of the following:

- Cover letter (in English) explaining why you are the right candidate for the position
- Comprehensive CV (in English) without any unexplained gaps
- Evidence of Teacher Qualification, including the list of subjects you're qualified in
- Two references from the last five years, one of whom must be a manager
