Multiple teaching positions for the Autumn term 2022

We are looking for two full-time teachers with the following teacher qualifications:

Position 1:

Subject teacher for years 4 to 9 in at least 3 of the following subjects: Civics, Geography, History or Religious Studies. There might be a possibility to combine these with teaching in another subject depending on the successful candidates' qualifications.

Position 2:

Subject teacher for years 4 to 9 in at least 3 of the following subjects: Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Technology or Mathematics.

The successful candidates will also be mentors for a class at school together with another colleague.

Who are we looking for?

The successful candidates will meet the criteria below. Emphasis will also be put on the candidates' personal traits as we are keen to find the right staff members to join our team of engaged teachers.

Essential:

- Swedish teacher qualification in relevant subjects for years 4 to 6 or years 7 to 9.
- Student-centred approach and able to forge positive relationships with pupils to encourage pupils' participation and learning.
- A confident and effective classroom teacher, sensitive to pupil needs and high expectations of what can be achieved.
- Ability to use formative and summative assessment to provide pupils with ample feedback about their learning and progress.
- Ability to individualise your teaching to engage and motivate pupils to develop and stretch within your subject(s).



- A flexible team player with good communication skills and the ability to take the initiative.
- Fluent in Swedish and proficient in English

Desirable:

- Qualification to teach years 4 to 9 in one or several subjects is highly advantageous.
- Other subject qualifications in addition to the ones mentioned above are desirable.
- Experience in working with and supporting pupils with special needs.
- Experience in using ICT in a school setting and preexisting knowledge of SchoolSoft and Google Classroom is extra desirable.
- Have the right to live and work in the United Kingdom.

The offered teaching positions are full-time and will commence on Friday, 12 August 2022. Any employment with the school will start with a probation period of one academic year which will extend to a fixed-term contract, a total of three years of employment.

Work visa

Following the UK's exit from the European Union, any non-British citizen must prove their right to live and work in the UK. If required, the Swedish School in London will sponsor and support the successful candidate to apply for a three-year work visa (paid by the school).

Moving allowance

For candidates hired from outside of the United Kingdom, we offer travelling and moving allowance. We can also assist you with information about the move to the United Kingdom.

Your application

Your complete application must be submitted in English due to visa requirements and consist of the following:

- Cover letter (in English) explaining why you are the right candidate for the position
- Comprehensive CV (in English) without any unexplained gaps
- Evidence of Teacher Qualification, including the list of subjects you're qualified in
- Two references from the last five years, one of whom must be a manager
