

Scholarship to Sixth Form, the academic year 2025/2026

Why does the Swedish School in London offer scholarships?

In Sweden, the student's home municipality pays for their education in Sixth Form. The student's school receives a grant from the home municipality, based on what a school place costs at the maintained school in that municipality. However, not all municipalities agree to transfer the school grant to Swedish schools abroad. Some municipalities agree to transfer the school grant for one school year only.

The purpose of our scholarship is, therefore:

- 1. To enable Swedish students, registered in a municipality that does not transfer the school grant to Swedish schools abroad to study at the Swedish School in London.
- 2. To enable current exchange students to stay longer than they otherwise might have been able to at the Swedish School in London, regardless of which home municipality the student is registered in.

Who is eligible to apply?

In order to be eligible to apply for the scholarship, the student must be registered in a municipality that does <u>not</u> offer the school grant (skolpeng/programpeng) to be transferred to the Swedish schools abroad at all, or for a second or third school year. The applicant must have made an application for the scholarship application to be considered.

What does the scholarship cover?

Student(s) receiving the scholarship will only pay £3,250 per semester in school fees (£6,500 for a whole school). This is equivalent to what students receiving the school grant (skolpeng/programpeng) from their Swedish municipalities, pay in annual school fees.

In addition, the student is also invoiced for accommodation in one of the school's host families if they do not have approved private accommodation.

How to apply?

Please submit your application before 14 April 2025 by sending the following documents to tdarwish@swedishschool.org.uk;

- Grade transcript from Secondary School (year 9) and, if applicable, grade transcript from Sixth Form if you have also attended another school. Transcripts can be in Swedish or English.
- Personal statement in English where you answer the questions:
 - Why are you applying for the scholarship?
 - How would you contribute to the school's ethos and culture if you were to be awarded the scholarship?



How is my application assessed, and by whom?

Registered applications are processed by a committée consisting of the:

- Deputy Headteacher with responsibility for Sixth Form
- Host Family Coordinator
- Headteacher

Applications are assessed based on the following criteria:

- Does the student fulfil the application criteria (see above)?
- Grade average from year 9 and if applicable from Sixth Form.
- The motive for applying for the scholarship.

When do I know whether or not I have been awarded a scholarship?

Applicants are notified by email about the scholarship committée's decision no later than 26th April 2025.
