The Swedish School in London is seeking a qualified and registered school nurse for a part-time position starting in August 2025. The exact scope of the role will be agreed in discussion with the successful candidate and based on student numbers.

This is a unique opportunity for someone who is passionate about working with children and young people in an international setting, and who would like to be part of a warm, collaborative, and professional team at a well-established Swedish international school.

About the school:

The Swedish School in London is a long-standing international school offering preschool and primary education in Barnes, and secondary education in Kew, South West London. Operated as a non-profit foundation, the school is inspected by both the Swedish Schools Inspectorate and the British regulator OFSTED. We are proud to hold four consecutive OFSTED *Outstanding* ratings.

We follow the Swedish national curriculum, delivered by fully qualified, passionate staff. At our school, you'll find:

- Confident and curious children/students aged 3 to 19.
- A supportive, international environment with clear routines and structure.
- A committed teaching team working closely with the student support team.
- A workplace where student wellbeing and personal development are prioritised.
- An opportunity to contribute to and further develop the school's student health provision.

About the role:

As our school nurse, you will play a central role in promoting preventative health and supporting a safe, inclusive school environment. You will be part of the student support team and work closely with school leadership, teachers, the SEN coordinator, and the school counsellor.

Your responsibilities will for example include:

- Conducting health conversations and basic health assessments
- Providing advice and guidance to students, parents/carers, and staff
- Contributing to student health work at individual, group, and organisational levels
- Liaising with local authorities and external agencies as needed

We are looking for:

Essential:

- A registered nurse, ideally with additional qualifications as a school nurse or paediatric nurse.



- Fluency in Swedish or another Scandinavian language.
- Is confident professional who builds trust and positive relationships with ease.
- A team player with a holistic view of student health
- Digitally literate and administratively competent
- Is digitally literate and administratively capable
- Minimum B2 level in English
- Existing right to live and work in the UK

Desirable:

- Registration with the UK's Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC).
- Experience working with children and young people, ideally in a school or similar environment.

What we offer:

This is a part-time position starting 15 August 2025. The exact hours will be based on the number of students enrolled and the qualifications of the successful candidate.

The initial contract will be for one year, including a three-month probationary period. Subject to a successful review and continued right to work in the UK, the contract may be extended. Salary is based on experience and qualifications.

Your application must be written in Swedish and include:

- A personal statement explaining why you are the ideal candidate for the role
- A complete CV with no unexplained gaps
- Proof of nursing registration and any relevant additional qualifications
- Two references from the past five years, including at least one from a line manager.
